The Federal Communications Commission is correcting a <u>final rule</u> that appeared in the Federal Register on 8 January 2024. The document issued a final rule permitting very low power (VLP) devices in the U-NII-5 (5.925-6.425 MHz) and U-NII-7 (6.525-6.875 MHz) portions of the 6 GHz band. This document corrects an error in one section of the final rule.

Effective 8 March 2024.
